We are excited to host the 7<sup>th</sup> annual Utah Valley Ashton Invitational. Made possible by generous donations and support from **Alan Ashton**. This tournament is by invitation only and every effort has been made to provide the best competition and sportsmanship possible to make this the best high school tournament of the year.

### **TEAM EXPECTATIONS & AGREEMENT:**

Each team is expected to provide a roster of their **top 14** players. 10 for Varsity and top 4 for JV. These 14 players are expected to play every match on **both days** of the tournament. Coaches, it is up to YOU to get the commitment from all your top players to attend.

No "**Special Accommodations**" will be made to move match times or locations. If your players have other conflicts like dances, day dates, work, weddings, other tournaments etc. and cannot commit to playing both days, please decline the invitation. No more than 10 players are allowed for varsity and 4 players for JV. Do not bring more than 14 players. You are allowed to change your lineup; however, we do not allow player substitutions. The same 14 players are expected to play both days and your rosters need to be filled out and turned in prior to your first match.

### **CANCELATION POLICY:**

Due to the challenge of replacing a team that cancels, the following cancelation policy will apply once an invitation has been accepted.

If you cancel less than 4 weeks prior to the start date – 50% refund.

15 days or less prior to start of tournament – No Refund

### **TEAM FEE: \$500 / TEAM (14 PLAYERS)**

To accept the invitation, you must pay your invoice. Payment must be received by the date on your invoice, or your invitation will be canceled, and another team will be invited in your place. You may pay by credit card or check. If paying by check, please make payment to: Pleasant Grove High School. ***If paying by card, please call 801-610-8170 and ask for the Finance office.***

**DATE & TIME:** Friday & Saturday April 25th & 26th. Varsity teams must check in for each match 30 min prior to their match time at each match location. JV Doubles teams must check in 15 min prior to each match at the tournament desk/ Director at Corner Canyon High School.

## CONTINUOUS COACHING EXPECTATIONS

Each team is allowed a total of 5 coaches. 3 coaches for Varsity matches and 2 for JV. Each coach must be identified to the site director prior to the start of each match, recorded on the draw sheets and cannot be changed once the matches begin.

We understand you may have 7 matches going on at the same time and your players may need your help before you may have time to get over to their court.

Continuous coaching allows designated coaches to instruct their players during changeovers, as well as in between points. This coaching method will be allowed for the duration of the entire match (tiebreaks included). However, continuous coaching **MUST NOT** interfere with the flow and timing of the match. Players have 20 seconds between each point, 90 seconds for each changeover, 2 min between the first two sets and 5 min between the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> set (10-point tie break). You may NOT pull your players over to the fence between points or after a game unless it is during a normal changeover.

A few reminders:

- Only certified & designated coaches are allowed to coach.
- Continuous coaching may begin once the point has ended but must stop when the server goes into motion for the next serve.
- Cannot slow the pace of play.
- Cannot coach during a point.
- Cannot be on the court unless during a changeover and only after the 1<sup>st</sup> game of each set.
- Coaching is NOT.... saying or yelling disparaging things about the other player/players to your player/players.
- Cannot cause distractions to opposing players/teams or other matches.

Remember the purpose of this is to help your players improve but not hurt others. Please remember this is a high school sporting event and more than likely there will be a lot of noise and distractions. Part of coaching is helping our players learn to concentrate and focus on their own match and learn to not let these things affect them. Distractions may come from fans, family, parents, friends or other teams and coaches. But as coaches, we should never do anything to intentionally hinder or distract the players. There is no room for disrespect or unsportsmanlike conduct, and we have a zero-tolerance policy on this.

If such a problem arises, those involved will be removed immediately from the tournament and the facilities. We are committed to putting on a highly competitive and fun event with sportsmanship being the top priority. Please help us make this happen.

**THE ASHTON AWARD:** This is the highest award offered by the tournament. It recognizes team excellence & sportsmanship. Each coach will vote for the team they believe displayed the best sportsmanship and overall excellence during the tournament.
